Summary: The Helltown Throwdown Individual and Dual Tournament is one of the larger western Montana youth wrestling tournaments. The Helltown Throwdown hosted 1000 wrestlers from Montana and surrounding states last year. Traditionally, the Throwdown has informally acts as the start of the youth wrestling season in Montana. It is the largest fundraiser for the Helena Wrestling Club (HWC). The Helltown Throwdown uses the Lewis and Clark Fairgrounds Exhibit and Entry Halls for 4 days. In 2024, the Throwdown will expand to 1 day for set up (Thursday), 2 days for the Individual tournament (Friday and Saturday), and 1 day for the Dual tournament (Sunday). The Helltown Throwdown uses official Montana Official Association referees and offers both an individual and team duals tournament within the same weekend. These factors make it attractive for competitive wrestlers to attend. The Throwdown maxed out at 1000 wrestlers in 2023, and the expansion of time will allow for more wrestlers to be included.

tournament honoring the late Wyatt Winfield. Wyatt passed in March of 2013 in a fatal car accident on Lincoln Road. Wyatt was from Helena and had many local connections. He was playing for the Juniors team the Helena Bighorns at the time of his passing. Since his passing, Wyatt's family created the Wyatt Winfield Be Tough Foundation which provides scholarships to the Helena area youth looking to pursue secondary education in the trades careers. The main fundraiser for the foundation is a 3 vs. 3 Hockey tournament held annually in the spring. Over \$100,000 has been raised and distributed in the form of scholarships over the

past ten years.
